Uniform & Grooming Behaviour Academics Attendance



Girls skirts - Need to be appropriate


Eye lashes and nails

Y12 Graduation evening – School expectations still apply








High expectations of the students...



- Mid year some students will have to change courses






High expectations of the students...








Mobile phones are not permitted during school hours

Retreat – compulsory.


Ball – Students are invited, students must attend school events

issues. More details to follow it is not a free for all.








